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## Helleborus - Hellebores

Helleborus belong to the Ranunculaceae - the Buttercup Family, to which Peony is a member.

There are about 15-20 species native to Europe and Western Asia.

They are bushy in growth with near evergreen palmately (hand-shaped) deeply-cut or divided thick leaves.

The various shades of green to blueish-green leaves often have coarsely serrated edges along with silver, marbling or variegation.

The beautiful foliage patterns are just about as diverse as the

flowers, with each color or cultivar having almost its own distinct foliage.

Depending upon Spring, they often will be blooming in Late March and continuing through April and into in May. Since the flowers don't have true petals, the sepals are the very showy parts of the flowers.

This also allows for the flowers to exhibit good coloring for much of their flowering season. The petals are reduced to an inner collar of nectar glands. On some cultivars, these glands have been selected to become quite showy, bringing another dynamic to some cultivars.

They are very tolerant of most any garden soil except for heavy wet clays.

Being very tolerant of deciduous medium to light shade, they can be quite a magnificent site blooming in the naturalized to formal garden. I would avoid planting them in hot afternoon direct sun.

They dislike being wet and will often rot from excessive moisture.

When planting, be careful not to cover their crowns with soil.

When mulching, I recommend very little much if any over the crowns, as this can also lead to rotting. When mulching the garden, I recommend flagging their locations before mulching, to prevent covering the crowns with mulch as well to prevent stepping on the crowns.

They can make good cut flowers if they are cut with the longest stems possible. Recut about 1" off the bottom of the stems while the stems are under water. The foliage also makes excellent cut foliage when treated the same way.

I never cut away the old foliage on the 20 or so Helleborus I have in my garden, I just allowing it to become part of the in-situ compost. Other gardeners just cannot tolerate the old winter damaged leaves laying on the ground, surrounding the bouquet of spring flowers erupting from the center. To me, it's part of the garden. Apparantely, removing the old foliage does not make any difference to the health of the plants.



They do respond to a good quality time release fertilizer, especially when applied in the autumn - since they grow so early in the spring. I fertilize mine with our PLGF - Perennial Landscape and Garden Fertilizer.

If you must divide them, do it in the spring as soon as the earth is thawed. They rarely, if ever, *require* division.
